Winter Greetings to all Students, Parents and Guardians of the Brock High School Community.

We have reached the end of our first semester of the 2019-2020 academic year, and our students and staff continue to demonstrate the excellence, achievement and community spirit that makes Brock High School one of the finest educational institutions in the Durham District School Board. Our Final Semester 1 Report Cards will go home on Thursday, February 6, 2020 at the end of the day.

February is Black History Month. In December of 1995, the Parliament of Canada officially recognized February as Black History Month in Canada. During February, the significant achievements and contributions in the areas of medicine, human rights, art, culture, politics, and public service made by peoples of African and Caribbean descent through history, as well as their struggles to overcome colonialism and racism, are officially recognized and celebrated. At Brock High School, we will be acknowledging Black History Month through daily announcements about contributions by Black Canadians, cross-curricular lessons investigating the impact of Black Canadians (e.g., \$10 bill), and in-class reviews of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) innovations developed by Black Canadians. We will also host Dwayne Morgan (@dwayne_morgan), a fantastic spoken-word artist and motivational speaker, to kick off our recognition of Black History Month. Mr. Morgan's messages include, "You are not a victim of life happening to you! Life is a reflection of your choices. You can choose to be a victim of life...or choose YOURSELF, YOUR LIFE, and YOUR DREAMS!"

February 26 is Pink Shirt Day. On February 25, students and staff are encouraged to wear a pink article of clothing to send the powerful message that discrimination related to homophobia, transphobia, and sexism will be challenged at Brock High School.
