- Semester 2: **February** to the end of **June**


Brock is a modified calendar school - we start the week before Labour Day

Ontario Secondary School Diploma Requirements

- **40 hours of community involvement:**
 - You can start the summer of your Grade 9 year (July of 2026)
- **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT):**
 - Occurs in your Grade 10 year
 - You must pass to graduate. Do NOT stress - you will get tons of help and support!

Ontario Secondary School Diploma Requirements

- 2 Online Learning Credits
 - Completed in a student's grade 11 or 12 year or full credit summer-school
 - Asynchronous and independent courses offered by a variety of school boards across Ontario
 - **There is an opt-out process.** The form is on Brock's Guidance website:

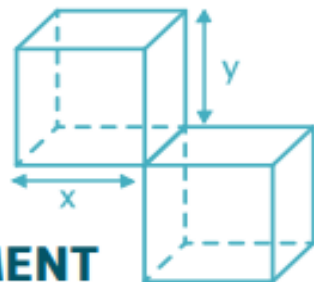

Numeracy

Students are encouraged to visit and register at tvomathify.com/students where certified Ontario teachers can be reached online 30 hours a week to provide **FREE Math tutoring** for students in grades 7-10.



GRADE 9 EQAO ASSESSMENT OF MATHEMATICS

Depending on the semester in which Grade 9 students take Mathematics, students must participate in the province-wide Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics in either January or June.

Students with an IEP may write this assessment with accommodations provided those accommodations are contained in their IEP.

The assessment is usually administered over a total of two hours during two consecutive Math periods.

In addition, parts of this assessment may account for a portion of the student's final grade.

Literacy

GRADE 10 ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

Completion of the literacy test requires students to write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) based on the literacy expectations of the provincial standard (Level 4).

If a student is unsuccessful in the first attempt or enroll in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Council (OSSLC) meets the requirements.

Students who are not successful in the first attempt, and in certain circumstances, students may be deferred until a later administration of the test. Accommodations for each student with special needs will be consistent with assessment accommodations on their IEP.

WHAT CAN I DO TO PREPARE?

Students are encouraged to use the EQAO website at eqao.com to access more information about the test and view practice assessments.

Many schools host activities such as after-school sessions to assist students in preparing for the OSSLT. Students are encouraged to attend these enrichment sessions to learn more about the OSSLT, participate in engaging activities, and receive important information about the test.

FRENCH EXEMPTIONS

- All students are being asked to select either Academic or Open level French in their Grade 9 year.
- Exemptions will be determined during your IPRC REVIEW with the Inclusive Student Services Department (Karen Clark).
- Student schedules will be adjusted to remove French once the exemption is approved.

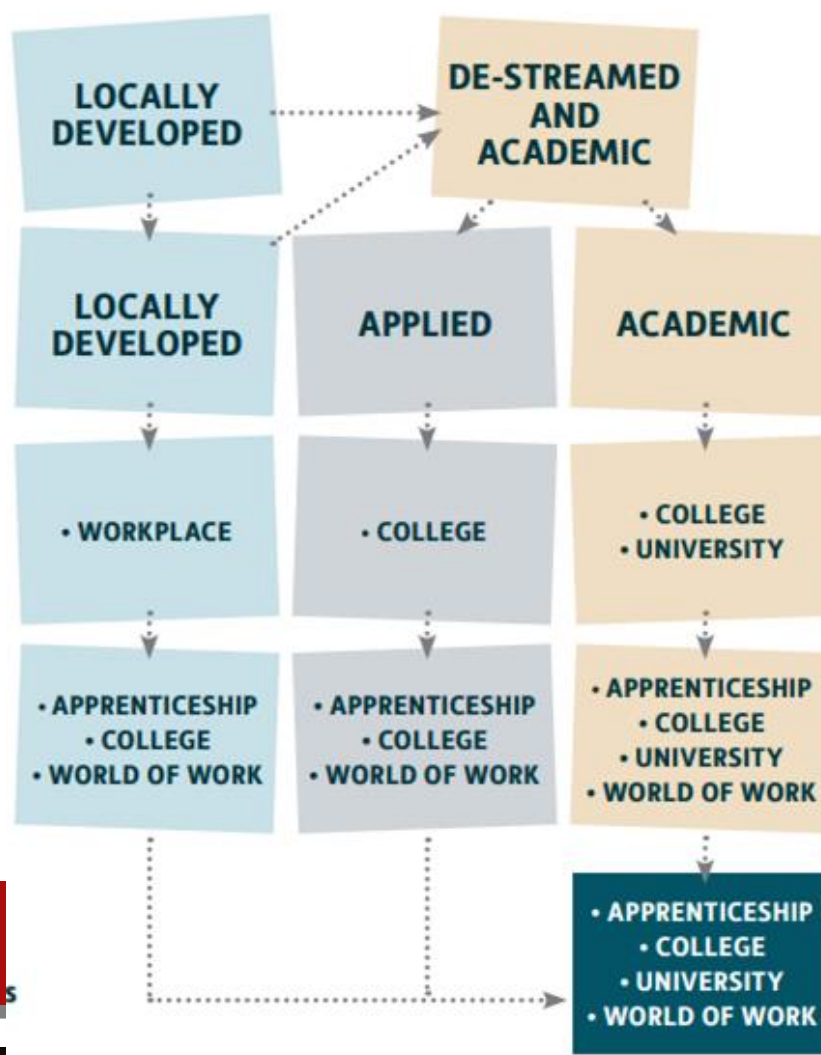
Knowing that not every student will be ready for all of the Grade 9 courses right away, we have locally developed curriculum to support students and prepare them to meet the expectations of the Grade 9 courses and support their credit accumulation.

Students who traditionally would have taken Locally Developed courses will still have this as an option.

They are not designed with the specific requirements of university, college, or the workplace in mind.”
